

Biliteracy Awards

Students participating in Dual Language Immersion have the opportunity to work towards various California State Biliteracy Pathway Awards, including the prestigious California State Seal of Biliteracy.

Biliteracy Pathway Awards for Kindergarten through grade 8 students include:

- Biliteracy Program Participation
- Biliteracy Attainment Recognition
- Home Language Development Recognition

The State Seal of Biliteracy is a recognition by the State Superintendent of Public Instruction for graduating high school seniors who have attained an elevated level of proficiency in speaking, reading, and writing in one or more languages in addition to English.

Program Design

The program is centered on promoting academic success by using language in a meaningful way. Students will be engaged in an enhanced learning environment in both languages. They will access authentic texts and content in various ways: books, websites, software, and video conferences.

The students will receive the same standards based curriculum as all students in the district through a 50/50 Spanish-English instructional language model.

- ◊ Go to the DLI campus of choice and let the registrar know you want your child in the DLI program.
- If the DLI campus is not your home site, fill out the intra-district transfer form which will allow your student to stay in DLI from K-6th grade.
- Sign an agreement to confirm your commitment to the DLI program.
