The State Seal of Biliteracy is a recognition by the State Superintendent of Public Instruction for graduating high school seniors who have attained an elevated level of proficiency in speaking, reading, and writing in one or more languages in addition to English.

Program Design

The program focuses on the academic success of students as they develop two languages: Spanish and English. This is a continuation of the elementary program DLI students have transferred from. Core content areas will be taught in either Spanish or English with an opportunity to expand their cultural awareness through enrichment activities, clubs and school-wide events.

Who can enroll?

Students who have been enrolled in an elementary DLI program from Kindergarten to grade 6 are eligible to enroll. Additionally, Spanish-speaking students who are newcomers to the U.S. education system (3 years or less) with mid to strong literacy skills in Spanish are welcome to join.
