


Native American Parent Advisory Committee Representation

- Teacher or Counselor
- High school student members who have an eligible ED 506 form with Tribal affiliation from a Federally or state recognized Tribe.
- Tribal Representative(s) on Indian lands located within 50 miles of any school that the agency will serve if such Tribes have any children with ED506 forms on file in such school.
- Parents and Family members of Indian children within the LEA who attend school in a Twin Rivers Unified School District school.

*NAPC meetings are open meetings and any parent, student or staff member may attend and provide input and program support.

NAPAC Chair Positions



- The Chairperson conducts the regular meetings of the Parent Committee.
- The Chairperson serves as a direct liaison to the following:
 - (a.) Members of the Parent Committee, ensuring ongoing communication, full participation, and monitoring of attendance
- The Chairperson follows Robert's Rules of Order as a guide to maintain parliamentary procedures at meetings.
- The Chairperson can be re-elected by the Parent Committee
