What is the California Voting Rights Act ("CVRA")?

- Took effect January 1, 2003
- Prohibits the use of "at-large" elections when such an election system:
 - "impairs the ability of a protected class to elect candidates of its choice or its ability to influence the outcome of an election...." (Elections Code § 14027.)



What is a "By-Trustee Area" Election System?

- Only safe harbor from a CVRA claim
- School district is divided into trustee areas
- A governing board member is elected from each trustee area
- Board members are elected <u>by only the</u>
 <u>registered voters in the particular</u>
 <u>trustee area</u> where the governing board
 member resides



Map Creation Considerations

Federal Requirements

- □ Equal Population
 - As equal as practical based on data and criteria from most recent Census Total Population
 - Within 10% variance between largest/smallest area
- □ Minority Voting Rights
 - No Discriminatory Purpose; No Vote Dilution
- Equal Protection
 - Race must not be a predominant factor

State Requirements

- Topography
- □ Geography
- Cohesiveness, Contiguity, Integrity, & Compactness of territory
- Community of Interest



Impact of Census

- Once transition made to by-trustee area election system, then following each federal census:
 - Governing board must approve adjustment of trustee area boundaries to make sure each the population in each trustee area is as nearly as equal as practical, among other things.
 - By 3/1/22



(Education Code section 5019.5(a).)



Impact of Census: Changes Needed

November/December 2021:

- If population per trustee is <u>no longer in balance</u>, the demographer will prepare draft map options that ensure compliance.
- Board selects a new map during Board meeting.
- Once selected, the Board can adopt a resolution authorizing staff to submit the new map and the District decision making process to the County Committee on School District Organization and Registrar for use.




